Conditions and limitations: -

- 1. To comply with the Documentation of Compliance SCV2.
- 2. Upon sale of the vessel Mecal must be notified immediately.
- 3. When the vessel is sold this certificate will be automatically cancelled.
- 4. Upon transfer to another certifying authority this certificate will only remain valid for 30 days following the transfer. It will then be cancelled.
- 5. All vessels that require stability information must carry the relevant stability information on board the vessel.
- 6. The vessel owner/operator has a statutory requirement to report accidents. The statutory requirements are given in the Merchant Shipping (Accident Reporting and Investigation) Regulations 201(2 (SI 2012 No.1743), as amended. (See MIN 698). 3.6.2 Where a vessel experiences an accident or incident resulting in damage affecting the safety of that vessel, the vessel owner/operator shall notify the Certifying Authority immediately, explaining the circumstances by which the vessel became damaged. The Certifying Authority may take action as deemed appropriate, which may include a full or partial examination of the vessel. Damage, detrimental to the safety of the vessel must be reported together with the measures proposed to effect repairs. The nature and extent of major repairs are subject to the approval of the Certifying Authority. The Mecal Certificate will be automatically suspended and reinstated when repairs have been completed to the satisfaction of Mecal.
- 7. Modifications must also be reported to Mecal beforehand and approved as required by the relevant part of the Code. "Modification" means any material change to the vessel or its equipment that would affect the vessel's compliance with statutory requirements, or that would require an amendment to its statutory certification, including the SCV2. In all cases Mecal reserves the right to carry out a confirming survey if deemed necessary. Operators have an obligation to report changes or damage to a vessel to the vessel's Certifying Authority under section 27 of the relevant Code. Failure to notify modifications or damage may be considered an offence.
- 8. It is the owner's responsibility to ensure that the vessel is manned as required by the Code when operating within the scope of the Code
- 9. It is an MCA requirement that for vessels operating with dual certification for more than one Area Category the vessel should be equipped and surveyed in line with the requirements of the more onerous category. If you wish to reduce the equipment on board to that of the lower category this is acceptable under the lower category certificate. However, the survey regime for the higher category must always be maintained.

This certificate is only valid for commercial operation on international voyages or voyages of more than 60 miles from a UK safe haven with seafarers on board if the certificate is accompanied by a valid MLC inspection report demonstrating compliance. "International voyages" includes, for a UK vessel, voyages within the waters of another State. The vessel is of course still required to comply with the operating limits set by its Code certification (Cat 0 to Cat 6).
